



- The Importance Listening...
- A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion. **Proverbs 18:2**



2 CORINTHIANS 10:3-6



"The purpose in a man's heart is like deep water, but a man of understanding will draw it out." PROVERBS 20:5

- 1. Questions to get to know people (surface-level)
 - How many loaves do you have? Matthew 15:34
 - Work, hobbies, hometown, family?
- 2. Questions to understand situations and emotions
 - Woman why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for? John 20:15
 - Open-ended "What do you think of..."; What's making you feel that way..."?
- 3. Questions about their spiritual understanding
 - For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul? Matthew 16:26
 - "Have you ever witnessed something unexplainable/paranormal/miraculous?"; Do you believe in fate/luck/karma?"; What do you think happens when we die?"

4. Questions designed to begin to pinpoint lies

- "Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter replied, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.'" Matthew 16:13-16
- Thought patterns "What brought about [x]?"; "Help me understand [x]?"; "Explain more of [x]?"; "Where did you hear [x] from?"; "What makes [x] true?"; "When did [x] start?"; "Did your parents talk about [x]?"

5. Questions to challenge lies

- "...Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?...Are you not of more value than [the birds of the air]? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his life?" Matthew 6:25-27
- Contextual and require good relating, remembering, and listening—"Do you think [x] is always true?"; "What about [y], how does that work with [x]?"; "You said [x] and [y], how do they work together?"; "Did you ever consider that [x] is not true?"

6. Questions to understand how they can be helped (ideally, we won't need to ask – we'll have already discerned)

- "What do you want me to do for you?" Luke 18:41
- Questions are to get them to acknowledge and accept help - "Would it be helpful if...?"; "Can I help you do...?"; "Can I pray for...?"
