#### How Does Pride Keep Us From Counsel?

#### 1. We underestimate our ignorance:

Therefore, the wise man listens to advice even (and especially) when he thinks he knows what's best.

#### 2. We avoid appearing weak:

Therefore, the wise man seeks out and listens to advice that helps him to fear the Lord more than he fears appearing weak, and to love people more than he loves his reputation.

#### 3. We predetermine the counsel we'll accept:

Therefore, the wise man does not pack the jury or skew the evidence, but listens to advice offered by honest advisors from multiple perspectives who have heard all the relevant information.
