MATTHEW 9:9-13

"9 As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. 10 And as Jesus reclined at table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples.





11 And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" 12 But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 13 Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."

- John MacArthur begins church focused on reformed theology


1980s




A SIMPLE DEFINITION

The Engel Scale




An eternal state of conscious, punishment and separation from God for those who have not put their faith and trust in Jesus.

"Neighbor" (Gk. *plesion* from pélas = near, near to, or from plesios = close by) literally means positionally nearby. Figuratively, plesion means whomever you have the ability to engage with.





MATTHEW 10:1-4



Authority **Over** All Things...

- He created all (see John 1:3)
- He holds all things together by the power of His word (see Hebrews 1:3; Col. 1:17)
- His miracles show his power over nature (see Luke 8:25)
- Over satan and his demons (see Mark 1:27, 3:15)
- Over all diseases and afflictions (see Matthew 9:35)
- Over all sin and death (see Mark 2:10; 1 Cor. 15:54-56)

Delegated Authority...

• **2 Corinthians 5:20** "Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us..."

• Matthew 28:18-20 "And Jesus came and said to them, "All <u>authority</u> in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

• John 17:1-2, 18 "When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him <u>authority</u> over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him....As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world.

7 Considerations on Healing Miracles...

- 1. The miracles must be the means, not the end...all glory to God in the name/authority of Jesus.
- 2. Experiencing a miracle doesn't mean you're a child of God.
- 3. We must remember that God doesn't always heal.
- 4. If healing doesn't occur immediately or over time, this doesn't mean we lack faith or are doing something wrong. It just means that we should keep praying and trusting.
- 5. Have you asked your elder(s) for prayer for healing?
- 6. As we go forth, ask the Lord for boldness and that He will move through us as we humbly and obediently respond to His call.
- 7. Don't get puffed up if the Lord does move through you in a miraculous way.

10 Considerations on Demonic Activity...

- 1. Speak the truth of the Word of God as much as possible.
- 2. Know the authority we have through Christ to act in the face of oppression.
- 3. When we identify demonic oppression, pray and speak into the spiritual forces by name.
- 4. When encountering demonic oppression and torment, turn to worship of the One True King.
- 5. Remain calm and unafraid.
- 6. What is cast out needs to be replaced by Holy Spirit or things will only get worse.
- 7. Continually grow to be effective in spiritual warfare.
- 8. Do not be enticed by knowledge of demons and the occult. Never go looking for the enemy.
- 9. Recognize that the enemy knows and fears Jesus. He will give Jesus feigned praise.
- 10. Give all glory to God in every victory over the enemy and point people to Jesus.



MATTHEW 10:8b-10

You received without paying; give without pay. **9** Acquire no gold or silver or copper for your belts, **10** no bag for your journey, or two tunics or sandals or a staff, for the laborer deserves his food.

MATTHEW 10:11-15

11 And whatever town or village you enter, find out who is worthy in it and stay there until you depart. 12 As you enter the house, greet it. 13 And if the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it, but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you. 14 And if anyone will not receive you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet when you leave that house or town.15 Truly, I say to you, it will be more bearable on the day of judgmer for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah than for that town.



Hebrew - Shalom Used 230+ times in OT

signifies a sense of well-being and harmony both within and without; perfect completeness, wholeness, and unity – especially as it relates to Yahweh



Greek - Eirēnē Used 92 times in NT

Refers to the state of untroubled, undisturbed tranquility despite the circumstances in which we find ourselves;

to bind, or weave together, the ability to hold it together no matter the state of things around us Defining a Person of Peace A person of peace will have a...





A Season of *PERSECUTION ENDURANCE* with *CONVICTION Parts 31-39 Matthew 10:16-42*

Matthew 10:16-25

16 "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. 17 Beware of men, for they will deliver you over to courts and flog you in their synagogues, 18 and you will be dragged before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them and the Gentiles. 19 When they deliver you over, do not be anxious how you are to speak or what you are to say, for what you are to say will be given to you in that hour. 20 For it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. 21 Brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death, 22 and you will be hated by all for my name's sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. 23 When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next, for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes.

24 "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant[<u>f</u>] above his master. 25 It is enough for the disciple to be like his teacher, and the servant like his master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign[<u>g</u>] those of his household.



Persecution Gk. Diōkō chasing, fleeing, pursuing, driving away Connotation is pursuing someone with the objective to do harm physical harm in particular


How to Endure: Lessons from Matthew 10

1. Know Truth and Walk by the Spirit 2. Expect reviling, false accusations, and persecution 2a. Practice through suffering 2b. Grow in the community of faith 3. Allow your pride to be killed (flee) 3a. Remember that God is sovereign and Christ is coming again. Do not become callous, apathetic, uncaring, or discouraged. 3b. Recognize temporal vs. Eternal 3c. Grow in faith and hope



Matthew 10:26-33

26 "So have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. 27 What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. 28 And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. 29 Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father.30 But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. 31 Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. 32 So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, 33 but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.





5 Fears Used to Keep Us From Sharing the Gospel...

- 1. I am afraid of not knowing what to say
- 2. I am afraid of rejection or failure
- 3. I am afraid of how they will respond to me.
- 4. I am afraid to share my story
- 5. I am afraid that I am a hypocrite



3 Reasons to Fear Not... 1. God has sent us and will enable us to accomplish the work 2. He is sovereign and in control – the results are His 3. He loves you

Matthew 10:34-37

34 "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. **35** For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughterin-law against her mother-in-law. **36** And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. **37** Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.







Practical Considerations for Sharing Truth with your Family

- 1. Know your identity as a child of God
- 2. Evidence acknowledgement of Christ
- 3. Seek forgiveness
- 4. Speak truth winsomely and wisely
- 5. Remember that transformation is a process
- 6. Share the love of Christ through critical times
- 7. Pray and discern your way forward


